Topic: Strategies for Writing the College App Essay

Date & Time: April 5, 2022, 7:00pm-8:00pm

Presenter: Jonathan Shapiro

Participants will learn effective writing strategies and read successful models for writing the personal narrative, which is very different from the academic analysis and argument most high school students are trained in. Particularly, language choices are very different, as is the role of tone, and organization. Also, the college app essay asks people to share, to delve into themselves, and some students struggle with this inner journey. Awareness of all of the above can help the student and parent find the process more rewarding than stressful.

The talk will address how to write the essay as well as the contingent challenges/opportunities that come with writing personal narratives for college admissions.

Jonathan Shapiro has been helping students write as a teacher and tutor for more than 20 years.

Jonathan's BA is in English from Rutgers College and his MFAs are from Sarah Lawrence College and the University of Washington.

Currently, Jonathan teaches writing and literature at Fordham University and tutors writing for not only college application essays, but also academic and creative writing.

At your earliest convenience, we ask that students and families please complete the NYC School Survey. Parents/guardians should complete one survey, and students complete a separate survey. You will need the student's 9-digit OSIS (ID) number, which you can locate on their NYCSA account.

Here are the instructions:

- Parents/Guardians: Access Code is the letter "f" (lowercase) followed by your child's OSIS number. (Ex: f123456789)
- Students: Access Code is your 9-digit OSIS
