The Princeton University Summer Journalism Program - Deadline March 23, 2018

This need-based scholarship welcomes 35-40 high school students from low income backgrounds to campus for an intensive, 10-day seminar on journalism. The program's goal is to diversify college and professional newsrooms by encouraging outstanding students from low-income backgrounds to pursue careers in journalism. All expense, including students' travel costs to and from Princeton, are paid for by the program. Students who attend the program come from across the country. The Cornell Future Architect Award - Deadline May 4, 2018

This merit-based scholarship is designed for current junior students who have shown an interest in and a talent for design and architecture, and may not otherwise be able to attend a summer program. The scholarship provides high school students with exposure to the rigors of a professional bachelor of architecture degree program and helps them to prepare elements of a competitive portfolio for application to design-based programs. The Introduction to Architecture Summer Program is centered on the architecture design studio, which is held in the afternoon and puts into practice information learned in morning lectures and integrated workshops. The studio is taught by Cornell Department of Architecture faculty members and recent graduates of Cornell's esteemed bachelor's and master's programs, and also incorporates periodic reviews by invited faculty and guest critics. Individual instruction and regular progress reviews prepare students for a final project presentation. Students earn 6 academic credits for successful participation in the summer program. The Posse Scholarship - Deadline May 4, 2018

Posse identifies public high school students with extraordinary academic and leadership potential who may be overlooked by traditional college selection processes. Posse attempts to expand the pool from which top colleges and universities recruit outstanding young leaders from diverse backgrounds in order to foster a more welcoming environment for all. The organization partners with colleges and universities to award Posse Scholars four-year full-tuition leadership scholarships. Posse places those students in supportive, multicultural teams - posses - of ten students. You must demonstrate leadership within your high school, community or family, demonstrate academic potential, and be nominated by your high school. Tech will be recruiting Posse nominees starting in early Spring.

The Cameron Impact Scholarship - Early Application Deadline May 25, 2018

This four-year merit-based scholarship is awarded annually in December to approximately 10-15 high school students. It is intended to cover the full tuition and educational expenses at the recipient's chosen collegiate institution and is estimated to be between \$20,000 - \$50,000 per year. The scholarship awards students with at least a 3.7 GPA who prioritize academic excellence and excel in a broad variety of extracurricular activities. Questbridge College Prep Scholars Program - Deadline March 21, 2018

This program rewards high-achieving, low-income students who have achieved academic excellence (at least 3.5GPA/90 average) and show strength in character. All College Prep Scholars receive exclusive access to 40 of the nation's best colleges at a Questbridge National College Admissions Conference, a head start on applying for college, and the prestigious distinction of being a College Prep Scholar, which identifies you as an outstanding candidate to top colleges. You could also receive full scholarships to college summer programs at Emory, Penn, Stanford, Yale and more. The majority of College Prep Scholars are selected as Finalists for the QuestBridge National College Match, their program that connects high school seniors with admission and guaranteed full four-year scholarships to the nation's best colleges. Must be from a household with an income of less than \$65,000 annually (for a typical family of four), with minimal assets. Free application process.
